I maintain close links to the Liverpool Upper Limb Unit and am a faculty member for the Advanced Shoulder Arthroscopy and the AO Upper Limb Trauma Course. This helps update my knowledge and ability to perform techniques in upper limb surgery. I have worked in conjunction with the physiotherapy department to provide efficient pathways for shoulder rehabilitation.

I take a keen and active interest in teaching and look forward to educating medical and non-medical staff. As a Demonstrator of Anatomy I obtained a teaching certificate and was involved in teaching medical students, physiotherapists and osteopaths. I was directly involved in organising specimens and conducting examinations. As a Consultant I enjoy applying anatomy to clinical situations in a problem solving manner. As a consultant I have further developed my teaching skills and have been directly involved in teaching and supervising other health professionals involved in orthopaedics. I use the framework of Intercollegiate Surgical Curriculum Programme and the Orthopaedic Curriculum and Assessment project to guide trainees and promote self learning skills.

I am faculty member for the Basic Surgical Skill Course run by the Royal College of Surgeon. This teaches basic knot tying and applies them to simple surgical procedures. Arthroscopic techniques are taught on the course. It is a pleasure to watch the students develop their skill over the course to help them gain confidence when they return to their base hospitals. It is also satisfying to identify a struggling individual and giving them extra time and then watch them achieve the end goal.

I initiated the South West Thames OWLS meeting where registrars meet monthly to review current Orthopaedic literature.

CLINICAL EXPERIENCE

I am a Consultant in Bedford dealing with upper and lower limb trauma with a specialist interest in Upper limb surgery since August 2009. I have introduced new techniques in providing recognised up to date techniques in upper limb and trauma surgery. I have submitted business plans to facilitate these new procedures ensuring that they are financially viable and the clinical quality is audited and compared with peers. I work closely with the physiotherapy and hand therapy department which enables patients receive correct and detailed information about their post surgical rehabilitation. This has allowed patients to receive physiotherapy closer to home, and promote streamlined pathways. By developing pathways that are patient orientated and listening to what we could have done better results in pathways that are patient centred and efficient for the tax payer.

When I started at Bedford in August 2009 there was no dedicated upper limb service, I have expanded the department with the help of my colleagues and we now have 3 surgeons dedicated to upper limb disorders and supported by 3 specialist physiotherapists.

I completed a Shoulder and Elbow fellowship in 2007 at the Liverpool Upper Limb Unit. I have introduced techniques which learnt on fellowship to improve patient care so they are receiving modern techniques in shoulder surgery. I maintain close links to the Liverpool Upper Limb Unit so I am able to remain updated with new techniques. I perform ultrasound scans of the shoulder independently to aid diagnosis of rotator cuff pathology. This helps me a one stop shoulder service and achieve the 18 week target set by the government. This has helped attract work from the surrounding area, enhancing the reputation and financing of the department

Team work is increasingly important within the NHS. I have the necessary skills to provide motivation and leadership of multi-disciplinary teams to continually look for ways to improve efficiency and patient care.

I have visited sports medicine centre's in New Zealand and Australia to further my knowledge in the diagnosis and management of sports related injuries. I work closely in conjunction with the physiotherapists to provide efficient pathways for non operative treatment of upper limb pathology, and post surgical rehabilitation. I enjoy working within dynamic teams and I am constantly looking for ways to further efficiency and working practice for the benefit of patients and staff. I will achieve the necessary targets set by the government while maintaining a high standard of patient care.
